As part of the Fee Review 2023-24 process, IP Australia is considering raising the costs that may be awarded in relation to Patents, Trade Marks and Designs proceedings. The current levels have not changed in many years and stakeholders have communicated that these costs are too low in relation to actual costs incurred by the parties involved. The policy setting remains that costs should generally not rise to the level of party/party costs but rather be a portion of the costs incurred.

We invite submissions from interested parties on the proposed changes as outlined below:
