Group Responsibilities

The Data and Technology Group (DTG) is driven by the IP Rights ecosystem. We work across many digital, technology and business domains to deliver ICT services and products to IP Australia, customers, stakeholders and ultimately the Australian public. DTG works across the agency to ensure our people have fit for purpose tools, products, and services to meet our commitments to the Australian Government. In collaboration with our stakeholders, we make decisions on information, data, investments, risks and IT security as they apply to our current and future capability. Our core focus is enabling the reliable and efficient administration of IP Rights through resilient and secure technology systems and platforms. Our aim is to improve the delivery and quality of experience for our DTG staff, customers and for our people.

Section Responsibilities

Business Delivery and Architecture (BDA) – comprises of cross-functional teams who are aligned to supporting business and customer facing platforms. Our teams deliver application development, application support, continuous improvement, change & release management, and self-service capabilities used by internal and external customers.

We deliver aligned products that have clear and logical boundaries, plus provide services to deliver agreed business outcomes. BDA are responsible for the delivery of development, maintenance, assurance and support of technical capabilities/components (software) required to deliver agreed business outcomes.

Our Opportunity

As a Software Developer working within the Search and Publications team, you will be responsible for development, maintenance, support and continuous improvement of a range of internally and externally facing applications that support IP Rights examination, searching, and quality assurance processes.

The role will be primarily focused on maintenance, support and continuous improvement of our Rights In One (RIO) Dashboard, RIO Internal Search, the Quality Review System and the recently released Plant Breeder's Rights Search and Australian Patent Search.

RIO Dashboard, RIO Search and associated applications use Spring Boot framework for its backend, FreeMarker for server-side rendering and Vue.js for Client-side rendering. These systems are hosted on AWS as ECS services and use PostgreSQL RDS database instances. External search systems (Plant Breeders Rights Search and Australian Patent Search) are mainly written in Vue.js framework.

You will be responsible for the maintenance support of legacy systems like Trade Mark Bulk Data Extract, Document Access Service, Patent Bulk Data, and Patent Bulk Specification which are Java based applications.

Although your home will be with the Search & Publications team, should priorities shift and the need for technical resources in other areas of ITG arise, you will also be expected to contribute your skills to development and maintenance of systems outside the teams remit.

Working in a multi-disciplinary team providing 2nd and 3rd level support for IP Australia's applications, the Senior Software Developer;

- Investigates and uncovers the root cause of issues, assesses the criticality/impact of the issues, records actions/outcomes in the applicable task management systems (e.g. ServiceNow, Jira, Azure DevOps) and reports them to their Team Leader where escalation or broader awareness is required
- Designs, codes, verifies, tests, documents, amends, and refactors complex programs, scripts and applications.
- Develops well-engineered solutions for identified issues and coordinates the deployment and testing of work through non-production environments, and into production, using agreed standards and tools
- Provides detailed and specific advice to internal and external stakeholders for the purposes of information sharing, quality assurance, feedback, and user support
- Participates in testing and quality assurance activities to ensure that requirements/specifications are met and quality outcomes are delivered to stakeholders. This includes knowledge sharing and assisting others in the team when required
- Contributes to strategic and team planning, provides input into and completes tasks identified in the teams' work plan, and commits to delivering the groups operational plan
- Develops user guides, technical documentation, knowledge base material, etc. and provides hands-on training for fellow team members, non-technical staff, and the wider user base, using a variety of information management tools such as ServiceNow, Confluence and SharePoint.

We are looking to fill this position on an ongoing basis. Future positions may be offered on an ongoing or non-ongoing basis subject to operational requirements. Where a non-ongoing position is offered, the role will be filled for a specified term of up to 12 months.

At the end of the recruitment process, a merit pool of suitable candidates may be created. Those found suitable will be advised that they have been placed in the pool. The merit pool is valid for 18 months from the date the process was advertised. The merit pool may be used throughout the period to fill similar positions in the event positions become vacant.

Job specific capabilities

The right person for this role will have the following attributes;

- A track record of taking responsibility for your work, managing and prioritising competing tasks, and collaborating with others to achieve deadlines and deliver upon commitments
- The ability to think critically, assess issues, provide resolutions, and see beyond your own work area to identify
 impacts on other users, systems, processes and stakeholders
- Well-developed communication skills and the ability to provide advice or information on complex technical matters in terms that the consumer can understand
- Ability to identify stakeholders and establish interpersonal business relationships to facilitate work activities; foster cooperation between teams; collaborate with senior team members and engage and escalate internally as required
- Demonstrated ability to effectively utilise a variety of task and information management tools to organise, prioritise and report on work progress, and document technical and procedural information
- Understanding of the importance of quality assurance, consistency/reuse, version control and deployment processes in an ICT context.

This will be supported by technical experience in the following areas.

- Experienced and demonstrated ability in the development of front-end applications using client-side framework like Vue.js
- · Sound knowledge and understanding of programming languages like JavaScript and Typescript
- Proficient in Java, with experience in Java frameworks like Spring Boot
- Understanding of server-side rendering technology like FreeMarker.
- Sound understanding of AWS and its services. Knowledge of Elastic Search Service is desirable
- Understanding of bash scripts in Linux
- Familiarity with build and deployment tools such as Gradle and GitHub.

Relevant tertiary qualifications and/or industry certifications in Computer Science, Information Technology or related is highly desirable.

It is expected that all IP Australia employees:

- demonstrate attitudes and behaviours responsive to workplace change (including participate in and encourage others to participate in change and contribute to successful outcomes)
- improve organisational performance through effective engagement with and management of risk within relevant sphere of influence

Eligibility requirements for employment at IP Australia

Under section 22(8) of the *Public Service Act 1999*, employees must be Australian citizens to be employed in the Australian Public Service (APS).

All applicants offered employment will be required to successfully undergo a pre-engagement screening check, even if they have a security clearance. The screening check involves reviewing your background & personal circumstances to minimise risks in giving access to IP Australia information/resources. This screening check is conducted in accordance with the Australian Government Protective Security Policy Framework requirements.

- The name and contact details of two referees.

How you will be assessed

IP Australia use competitive merit-based recruitment processes. Candidates will be assessed against the job specific capabilities and duties, so it is important you frame your response around these.

IP Australia has its own capability framework that provides clarity and consistency for a professional and highly competent workforce, now and into the future. There are five core capabilities, relevant to each classification, and a +1 technical capability which varies depending on the role.

IP Australia uses a range of assessment methods which may include application and resume assessment, interview and/or written assessment and/or psychometric assessment and the collection of a referee report/s.
